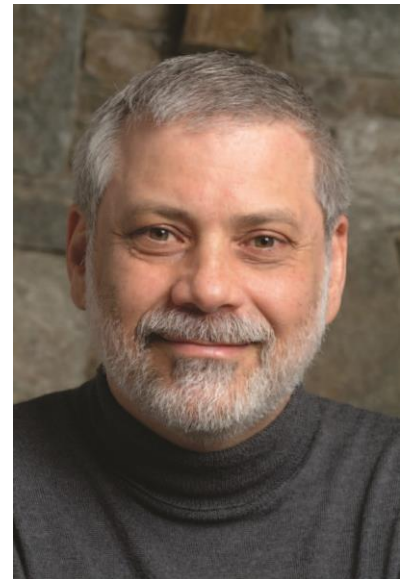

Mena’hem Teitelbaum, a survivor of Nazi concentration camps, has been running from his experience all his life. But instead of running away from a place, he has been running away from himself. What the Nazi-system and gas chambers did not bring to an end he has completed. He has killed the Jew inside of him. This was for him the only way to forget about the horror, the torture, the drama. Between the grave, suddenly a momentous wish in his arises; when he dies, he wants to be buried there. But in order to be buried in the cemetery you have to be Jewish and much to his surprise simply being Jewish is not enough. A Rabbi points it out clearly to him, “If you say you’re Jewish, you have to prove it!”

Srulik, an eight-year-old boy, flees from the Warsaw ghetto in 1942. He attempts to survive, at first alone in the forest, and then as a Christian orphan named Jurek on a Polish farm.
